Secto Rally Finland 2023

The history of the Secto Rally Finland – Round 8 of the FIA World Rally Championship – dates back to

1951. Formerly known as the Thousand Lakes Rally, this legendary event is famous for its fast gravel

roads, impressive jumps and magnificent lake scenery. The Secto Rally Finland is among the largest

annual events in the Nordic countries, and it attracts one of the highest numbers of participants in

the World Rally Championship series. With its 290,000 spectators, the Secto Rally Finland has been

selected as the best event in the series on several occasions.

Matti Nykänen's hill

The observation tower of a ski jump legend Matti Nykänen is open for public. Get to see the city of

The World of Hydrogen

The Aalto2 exhibition takes people of all ages into the world of the smallest but most abundant

element in the universe: hydrogen. The exhibition focuses on green hydrogen, exploring how it is

present in our daily lives in Central Finland today and in the future. Through the exhibition, Cefmof

aims to raise awareness and interest in the potential of green hydrogen.

The exhibition is organized by the Central Finland Mobility Foundation (Cefmof), a foundation

established by the City of Jyväskylä, TOYOTA GAZOO Racing World Rally Team, and the Toyota

Mobility Foundation. The exhibition has been created in collaboration with the Aalto2 Museum

Centre, Jyväskylä University of Applied Sciences, and the University of Jyväskylä.

Visit Petäjävesi old church (UNESCO World Heritage site)

Visit the real gem of churches in Finland, the Petäjävesi old church which was built in the 1760s. An

entrance ticket to the church includes a guided tour in which you will hear fascinating stories about

the church, covering time period from 1760's to the 20th Century. The cost is 9€ per person. Guided

tours begin at 11 am, 1 pm, 3 pm and 5 pm or by request. The ticket includes entrance fee and a

private guided tour for your group (30 minutes).

Interested in nature? Check out these possibilities:

Places with scenic views in the Jyväskylä region

In the Jyväskylä Region, there are many wonderful nature sites with breathtaking views. Leave the hustle and bustle of the city behind as you head to the top of the Kanavuori Hill, take a day trip to the Vaarunvuoret hills via the breathtaking Kärkistensalmi strait or escape to Paljaspää Island, where the legendary Finnish architect Alvar Aalto once lived. At Korpilahti you can visit the Oravivuori triangulation station that is part of the Struve Geodetic Arc and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You can also find beautiful sceneries in Laajavuori, where you can admire the views and enjoy a wide range of activities throughout the year. If you'd rather stay in the city, the Harju Tower has great views over Jyväskylä's rooftops.

Visit the Oravivuori triangulation point in the Struve chain (UNESCO world heritage site)

Oravivuori arc point is a part of Struve Geodetic Arc. This UNESCO world heritage site near Jyväskylä represents the cultural heritage of science and technology. The Struve Geodetic Arc was laid out and measured in 1816-1855 with the aim of determining the size and shape of the Earth. The Struve Geodetic Arc is a chain of survey triangulation measurements stretching from the Arctic Sea to the Black Sea, through ten countries and over 2,820km. (Source: Visit Jyväskylä.)

Cruises

In the Jyväskylä region, the wonderfully lush nature surrounding the bodies of water is always close by. The largest of the lakes in the Jyväskylä region is Päijänne, which is also the longest lake in Finland. The harbour, located right next to the city centre, offers high-quality services and a variety of things to do for both landlubbers and boaters. The area also hosts events from markets to music festivals. The jogging and cycling route Rantaraitti, which is popular with the locals, goes past the harbour.
