Principles for a safer and braver space



- Engaging with others with an open mind and showing respect and acceptance for others as well as for yourself in learning situations.
- Valuing, respecting and understanding others, even in situations where we don't agree with their opinions or ways of doing things.
- Allowing everyone room to be themselves. Respecting everyone's differences and experiences.
- Teaching groups are inherently diverse, so it's good to be aware of one's personal preconceptions: we don't know each other's characteristics, experiences, boundaries or life situations.
- Creating space for everyone to participate in discussion and activities: listening, asking questions, giving time and learning from each other.
- When people are offended, they can ask for and receive forgiveness.
- Considering other participants when choosing which languages are used and using different languages and language resources flexibly at one's own level.

Guidelines for dealing with violations of these principles



- If you notice someone violating these safer space principles, intervene in the situation.
 - Let the people involved and/or the teacher who is present know of the situation.
 - If you are unwilling or unable to talk to the people involved or the teacher, there are other
