You are participating in scientific study. This privacy notice informs you about the processing of your personal data as part of the study. You have the right to receive this information by law.

1. Data controller(s)

The data controller is responsible for the lawfulness of the processing of personal data in the study.

2. Processor of personal data:

A *processor of personal data* refers to a party that processes personal data on behalf of the data controller and according to the data controller's instructions. A data processing agreement must be signed with the processor of personal data. In this research, the processors of personal data are the members of the research group at the University of Jyväskylä.

During the implementation of the research, the data controller can also use processors of personal data who cannot be named in advance. Appropriate agreements must always be made with processors. Suitability of the processors for the secure processing of personal data must be assessed before an agreement is made. The data subject will be informed separately about the use of another processor if the change is significant from the data subject's point of view.

To ensure the accuracy of research data, the data controller may submit data for processing (primarily without direct identification data) to a so-called research reviewer or verifier for a defined period when necessary. These reviewers or verifiers work under the supervision of research staff. Data processing agreements are made with them if they receive personal data.

3. Other disclosure of personal data during the study

Your data will be treated confidentially and will not be disclosed to third parties. A portion of the pseudonymized data collected by JYU (without identifying information and, where necessary, with background variables removed or re-categorized to prevent identification) will be shared with researchers at the Karolinska Institutet for comparative research purposes. A data sharing agreement (DSA) will be established between the organizations.

4. Personal data processed in the *Parenting Navigator* study

Your personal data will be processed for the research purpose described in the information.

The following personal data will be collected anonymously from you: age, gender, marital status, educational background, place of residence, employment status, number of children receiving special support, possible functional limitations, and survey responses regarding the support you receive, your wishes for support, and your well-being.

The following specific personal data groups will be processed in the study:

5. The lawful basis for processing personal data in scientific research

6. Transfer of personal data outside the EU/EEA

Your data will not be transferred outside the EU/EEA in the study.

7. Protection of personal data

The processing of personal data in this study is based on an appropriate research plan and the study has a responsible person. Only information necessary for the purpose of the study is stored in the study register.

The data will be processed securely during the study. For example, questionnaires will be answered anonymously using a separate research code. 8. Processing of personal data after the end of the study

9. Rights of the data subject

Right to access information (Article 15 of the General Data Protection Regulation)

You have the right to be informed whether and what personal data about you are being processed. You can also request a copy of the personal data being processed, if you wish.

Right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR)

If there are inaccuracies or errors in your personal data being processed, you have the right to request their rectification or completion.

Right to erasure (Article 17 GDPR)

You have the right to request the erasure of your personal data in certain cases. However, there is no right to erasure if erasure would prevent or significantly impede the achievement of the purpose of the processing in scientific research.

Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR)

You have the right to restrict the processing of your personal data in certain situations, such as if you contest the accuracy of your personal data.

Derogation from rights

The rights described here may be derogated from in certain individual cases on the grounds provided for in the General Data Protection Regulation and the Finnish Data Protection Act to the extent that the rights prevent or greatly hinder the achievement of a scientific or historical research purpose or statistical purpose. The need to derogate from rights is always assessed on a case-by-case basis. Rights may also be derogated from if the data subject cannot or can no longer be identified.

Archiving

When personal data are processed for archiving purposes in public interest, the data subject generally does not have the rights described above. The authenticity, reliability and research value of the archived materials are jeopardized if the personal data contained in the materials were to be altered. The derogation from the rights is based on Section 32 of the Data Protection Act and Article 17(3) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Profiling and automated decision-making

In research, your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making. In research, the purpose of processing personal data is not to evaluate your personal characteristics, i.e. profiling, but your personal data and characteristics will be evaluated from the perspective of a broader scientific study.

Exercising the rights of the data subject
