PRIVACY NOTICE – CHILDREN’S GUARDIANS AND CHILDREN

You and your child are participating in scientific research. This privacy notice informs you about the processing of your and your child's personal data as part of the research. You have the right to receive this information by law.

Data controller(s) in the study SITES – Social inclusion and diversity in Early Childhood Education and care study

The data controller is responsible for the lawfulness of the processing of personal data in the study.

Research directors

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Members of the research team who process personal data in the study:

SITES project researchers, all of whom are employed by the University of Jyväskylä, as well as postgraduate students who will be recruited to the project in the future. The data will also be processed by the project's research assistants, trainees, and students writing their theses on the project. A separate agreement on the processing of personal data will be concluded with persons other than those employed by the university who handle the material. Further information on these persons can be obtained from the directors.

Personal data processor(s)

A personal data processor refers to an entity that processes personal data on behalf of the controller and in accordance with the instructions provided by the controller. A data processing agreement must be drawn up with the personal data processor. In this study, the processors of personal data are the following information systems and data processing tools: Cloud services managed by Microsoft JY.

During the implementation of the study, the controller may also use other processors of personal data who cannot be named in advance. The necessary agreements are always made with the processors, and their suitability for the secure processing of personal data is assessed before the agreement is made. The data subject will be informed separately of the use of a processor if the change is significant from the data subject's point of view.

In order to ensure the accuracy of research data, the controller may, if necessary, provide data (primarily without direct identifiers) to a research monitor or verifier for a fixed period of time. These persons work under the supervision of the research staff, and data processing agreements are concluded with them.

Other disclosure of personal data during the investigation

Your personal data will be treated confidentially and will not be disclosed to third parties.

Your personal data will be processed for the research purposes described in the notice.

The following personal data about you and your child will be collected in the study: **guardian:** name, age, gender, email address, phone number, country of birth, nationality, native language and languages spoken at home, religious or philosophical beliefs, video recording, audio recording, early childhood education plan discussion, interview notes; **child:** name, age, gender, country of birth, nationality, native language and home languages, religious or philosophical beliefs, video recordings, audio recordings, observation notes, interview notes, photographs, videos, network map, early childhood education plan, and other early childhood education documentation related to the child. The collection of data is based on the research plan.

The study deals with the following specific categories of personal data:

This privacy notice is provided to research participants together with the research information sheet. Consent forms are mainly collected from participants electronically using Redcap, but participants can also fill out a paper consent form if they wish, which will be stored electronically and destroyed in paper form. The consent of children to participate in the study will be ensured at an age-appropriate level before data collection, and the consent of children will also be closely monitored and evaluated during data collection.

Protection of personal data

The processing of personal data in this study is based on an appropriate research plan, and the study has a designated person in charge. Only data that is necessary for the purpose of the study will be stored in the study registry.

Removing identifiability

PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA AFTER THE END OF THE RESEARCH

The research register will be archived at the end of the original research use, estimated to be at the end of 2036, with identifying information, i.e., including personal data, in the archives of the University of Jyväskylä. The research group may use the archived material for scientific research in the public interest based on the research plan submitted to the archive. The material is not openly available, but any requests from outside the research group to use the material will be assessed by the University of Jyväskylä on a case-by-case basis.

Legal basis for archiving personal data contained in research material after the research has been completed

Archiving of research materials and cultural heritage materials in the public interest (research material is archived after the research has been completed and the material to be archived contains personal data), the material to be archived is assessed for value (Article 6.1 e of the General Data Protection Regulation, special categories of personal data 9.2.j).

Rights of the data subject

Right of access to information (Article 15 of the General Data Protection Regulation)

You have the right to obtain information about whether your personal data is being processed and what personal data is being processed. You may also request a copy of the personal data being processed.

Right to rectification (Article 16 of the General Data Protection Regulation)

If there are inaccuracies or errors in your personal data being processed, you have the right to request that they be corrected or supplemented.

Right to erasure (Article 17 of the GDPR)

You have the right to request the deletion of your personal data in certain cases. However, you do not have the right to request the deletion of your data if doing so would prevent or significantly impede the purpose of processing in scientific research.

Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 of the General Data Protection Regulation)

You have the right to restrict the processing of your personal data in certain situations, such as if you dispute the accuracy of your personal data.

Derogation from rights

In certain individual cases, the rights described here may be deviated from on the grounds specified in the General Data Protection Regulation and the Finnish Data Protection Act, insofar as the rights prevent or significantly impede the achievement of scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes. The need to derogate from the rights is always assessed on a case-by-case basis. The rights may also be derogated from if the data subject cannot be identified or can no longer be identified.

Archiving

When personal data is processed for archiving purposes in the public interest, the data subject does not, as a rule, have the rights mentioned above or the right to object under Article 21 of the GDPR. The authenticity, reliability, and research value of archived materials would be compromised if the personal data contained in the materials were to be altered. This derogation from rights is based on Section 32 of the Data Protection Act and Article 17(3) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

Profiling and automated decision-making

Your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making in the study. The purpose of processing personal data in the study is not to evaluate your personal characteristics, i.e. profiling, but rather to evaluate your personal data and characteristics from the perspective of broader scientific research.
