You are participating in scientific research. In this privacy notice you will get information on how your personal data, and/or the personal data of your child, is used and processed as part of the research. You have the legal right to receive this information.

1. **Data controller(s) in the scientific research “Supporting motor skills, physical fitness and psychosocial well-being in pupils with motor difficulties – a cluster-randomized controlled intervention (MoDiSchool)”**

The data controller is responsible for ensuring that the processing of personal data in the study complies with the law.

Members of the research team processing the personal data in the study:

The researchers, experts, and research assistants of the University of Jyväskylä and Jamk University of Applied Sciences who work in the MoDiSchool research project. Degree students of the University of Jyväskylä also process the data as part of their theses.

2. **Data processor(s) of personal data**

A data processor acts under the instructions of the data controller only, by processing personal data on behalf of the data controller. A data processing agreement must be drawn up with the data processor. In this study data processors are:

- Microsoft; Managed cloud services of JYU
- ATLAS.ti Scientific Software Development GmbH

During the research, the data controller may use data processors that cannot be identified in advance. There are always all necessary agreements drawn up with the data processor and their suitability for secure processing of personal data is assessed before agreeing to data processing. The data subject is informed separately about the use of the data processor if the change of data processor is significant for the data subject.

To ensure the accuracy of research information, the data controller may provide data for processing (primarily without direct identifiers) to the research monitor or verifier for a set period if necessary. They operate under the supervision of the research staff and data processing agreements are drawn up with them.

3. Other disclosure of personal data during the research

All your personal data is handled confidentially, and your personal data is not disclosed to third parties. Information related to the child's well-being and health may be disclosed to the teacher with separate consent from the parents.

Your personal data, from which direct identifiers have been removed, may be shared during the study with other universities or organizations for a purpose that is compatible with the original one, when the processing is based on the public interest. In that case, it is ensured that adequate technical and organizational safeguards are in place. If you wish, the principal investigator of the research will give you exact information about where your information has been shared. No personal data, code key or other information by which participants could be identified is shared with them. When data is shared, an agreement is used that requires the recipient to act in accordance with good scientific practices.

4. Personal data processed in the MoDiSchool research

Your personal data will be processed for the research purposes described in the research information sheet. The processing is based on the research plan.

The following personal data is collected during this research:

Data collected from children: name, gender, date of birth, school, class, country of birth, measurement data related to motor skills, physical activity and physical functioning, survey responses (for example, experiences related to physical activity and well-being), diaries.

Data collected from parents/guardians: name, date of birth, gender, country of birth, email address, phone number, family socioeconomic status, family relationships, survey responses, the child's behaviour and motivation, the child's health and well-being, the child's home environment and leisure time, the language spoken at home, support provided to the child, parents' well-being.

Data collected from teachers: name, gender, date of birth, email address, phone number, teaching experience, survey responses, students' behaviour and motivation, students' health and well-being, beliefs and thoughts related to being a teacher and teaching, students' motor skills and physical activity, matters related to students' learning and schooling, audio recording, interview notes, diaries.

The research processes the following special categories of personal data:

7. Protection of personal data

The processing of personal data in this study is based on an appropriate research protocol, and the study has a principal investigator. Only the personal data that is necessary for the purposes of the research is stored in the research register.

8. PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA AFTER THE END OF THE STUDY

The research material will be archived anonymously after the study and verification period have ended in 2035. The anonymous data will be archived in the University of Jyväskylä research data archive. The data will be available from the archive for research purposes.

9. Rights of the data subject

The right to access information (GDPR Article 15)

You have the right to be informed about whether your personal data are processed and what personal data are being processed. You can also request a copy of the personal data being processed if you wish.

The right to rectification (GDPR Article 16)

If there are inaccuracies or errors in your personal data being processed, you have the right to request that they are corrected or supplemented.

The right to erasure (GDPR Article 17)

You have the right to request the deletion of your personal data in certain cases. However, the right to erasure does not apply if deleting the data prevents or significantly hinders the achievement of the purposes of scientific research.

The right to restriction of processing (GDPR Article 18)

You have the right to have the processing of your personal data restricted in certain situations, for example if you dispute the accuracy of your personal data.

Limitations on rights

In certain individual cases, the rights described here may be derogated from based on the grounds set out in the GDPR and the Finnish Data Protection Act, to the extent that the rights would prevent the achievement of the purposes of scientific or historical research or statistical purposes, or make them significantly more difficult to achieve. The need to derogate from rights is assessed case by case. Rights may also be derogated from if the data subject cannot or can no longer be identified.

Profiling and automated decision-making

In this study, your personal data are not used for automated decision-making. The purpose of processing personal data in this study is not to evaluate your personal characteristics, i.e. profiling, but your personal data and characteristics are evaluated from the perspective of broader scientific research.

How your rights are implemented
